# POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT (PBS) – YOUR VOTE COUNTS

As you have read in previous newsletters our school is becoming a PBS school. 'Positive Behaviour Support' (PBS) is a process for teaching positive behaviours within the school.

Part of the implementation stage includes defining 3-5 key expectations. We are asking the broader school community (you, the parents and families) to help develop these expectations. Examples of this will be displayed on Parent's Night.

Here are some examples of other schools expectations as a guide to what we would like to achieve.



From Staff and Student input already gained, we are aiming to use the expectations of Responsibility/Safety Academics and Respect /Caring as our framework, the PBS leadership team has decided on how these may be promoted throughout our school and wish you to vote on the following options.

U GROW (Acronym) - Go safely, Respect yourself and others, Own your actions, Work hard

**2** Be your Personal Best, Be Respectful and Caring, Be Responsible

Strive to do your best, Consider Others, Be Responsible, Show Pride

Between now and Parent Night held on August 31, we ask you to have a think about which wording you like and discuss it with your children and family. You may even come up with some different ideas. On the Parent Night you will have the opportunity to see other schools examples, ask questions and vote on your favourite at the PBS booth, located in the school corridor. Each submission will go into a draw to win a prize and ultimately contribute to helping the school to make a final decision.

- A small prize will be presented to the first correct answer drawn at the mini assembly on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September.


