## HEALTH

In Health this term, classes from Kindy to year 6 have been focusing on drug and poison awareness. This involves the use and effects of analgesics, smoking, caffeine, and, for the older students, some recreational drugs. We have also looked at safe storage of drugs and poisons.



In August Mrs Garton kindly organised a member of St John's Ambulance (Ange) to visit Years 3-6 and give them a quick first aid lesson. The students all learnt how to put someone in the recovery position if they are unconscious and how to check their airways. We also found out that dialling 999, 911 or 111 will all link through to 000 in Australia now. 000 is still the quickest and best way to call an emergency though.

Ange introduced us to a fantastic App called 'First Responder.' It is free to download and will give emergency services your GPS location if you call 000. There are many other valuable resources available on

the app that are very worthwhile. I hope you all looked at the Drug Awareness displays in the classrooms on Parent Night. The classroom teachers and the students all worked very hard in producing quality work and I would like to thank them for their efforts.
