#### STAY SAFE FROM SWOOPING MAGPIES

The Department of Parks and Wildlife would like to remind you that the magpie breeding season is upon us.



During this time, magpies often display territorial behaviour to protect their young, including swooping at passers-by. There are a few techniques that can be used to avoid or minimise the chance of a magpie attack. The best is to simply avoid the area where magpies are known to be swooping. The Department of Environment and Resource Management also suggest the following safety tips:

- wear a hat, helmet or sunglasses
- get off your bike and walk
- walk in a group
- never approach a baby magpie
- keep an eye on the magpie, as they don't tend to swoop when being watched.

## HERE ARE FOUR THINGS A FAMILY CAN DO TO RAISE A GREAT READER

(BY VARIOUS UNIVERSITY STUDIES)



### They are:

- **Bedtime Matters** Children with irregular bedtimes or going to bed after 9pm did poorly in reading tests, a University College London study found. Routines are important for children.
- Up Their Omega 3s A six-month study published in the Journal of Child Psychology and Psychiatry found that 9 and 10 year olds who were given a supplement of the omega-3 acids DHA and EPA, plus a small amount of omega-6, were better able to read aloud, had superior pronunciation and had less trouble reading a series of letters quickly than those given a placebo. Only 6% of Aussie kids get enough omega-3.
- Read Aloud Continuously When we read aloud to children we read books that are beyond their ability, so they're being introduced to new vocabulary; and the size of their vocabulary is the best predictor of how they'll do at school. A recent Australian survey found that the number of parents who are reading to their children on a regular basis rapidly declines from the age of six, with only 4% doing so after they've turned 9.
- Turn Real Pages It's important children see their parents reading a physical book. A lot of parents read on devices but children don't know that's what they're doing. They could be flicking through their Instagram feed! When you've got a book in your hand, there's no mistaking you're reading. This is a great model for children to follow.




What: Raise money for Telethon


When: Monday 15 Oct – Friday 19 Oct




School Disco - Can you help?
