ASHS STEM INCURSION

Yesterday we had Mr Brett Gaskell from Australind Senior High School (ASHS) working with our Year 5s and 6s in the area of Science, Engineering, Technology Mathematics (STEM). It was a very exciting activity to build a hovercraft from a paper plate and power it with a simple circuit. Students were then able to compare the amount of force (push) required to move their hovercraft and then test their hypothesis by riding a hovercraft powered by a leaf blower! I would like to thank Mr Gaskell and ASHS for providing this program to our students free of charge.


Come and join us for a fun, end of year party!
