NAPLAN 2020



Parents of Year 3 and Year 5 students will be receiving a brochure in the next few days which gives information about NAPLAN 2020. A large consideration is that CPPS will be conducting NAPLAN online for testing this year. Testing commences on May 12, 2020 and concludes at Clifton Park Primary School on 15 May, 2020. More information about the scheduling and finer operational

details will be passed on shortly. Any absence from school during this time will significantly impact on your child's access to this testing. If you are aware of any planned absence between the May 12 and May 15, please be in touch with Mrs Deborah Jolliffe as soon as possible. We have commenced a technical readiness program with Year 3's and 5's to ensure that all students have the ICT skills required to feel comfortable and familiar within the testing browser. If parents would like to assist their children further, Mathletics and Reading Eggspress tasks at home are suitable familiarisation activities.
