Jennifer Payne is a teacher and psychologist who is passionate about supporting educators to meet the needs of students in regional and remote areas. Jennifer loves taking the research into what works and putting it "out" and useful for classroom educators.

Sharonne Telfer possesses PhD in Western Australia 8 years ago and has trained hundreds of school staff in implementing school-wide positive behaviour strategies. Sharonne supports educators to implement evidence-based positive classroom practices to support success for ALL students.

He will be speaking about how and why he started Positive Behaviour Supports over 20 years ago, why over 30 thousand schools, children's services and youth services around the world use it, and how parents can use positive behaviour support strategies with their own children. Dr Lewis is an engaging speaker who is passionate about supporting adults to help children be more behaviourally and socially successful.
